- A. GENERAL CONDITIONS SET OUT IN SUBPART D OF 50 CFR 13, AND SPECIFIC CONDITIONS CONTAINED IN FEDERAL REGULATIONS CITED IN BLOCK #2 ABOVE, ARE HEREBY MADE A PART OF THIS PERMIT. ALL ACTIVITIES AUTHORIZED HEREIN MUST BE CARRIED OUT IN ACCORD WITH AND FOR THE PURPOSES DESCRIBED IN THE APPLICATION SUBMITTED. CONTINUED VALIDITY, OR RENEWAL, OF THIS PERMIT IS SUBJECT TO COMPLETE AND TIMELY COMPLIANCE WITH ALL APPLICABLE CONDITIONS, INCLUDING THE FILING OF ALL REQUIRED INFORMATION AND REPORTS.
- B. THE VALIDITY OF THIS PERMIT IS ALSO CONDITIONED UPON STRICT OBSERVANCE OF ALL APPLICABLE FOREIGN, STATE, LOCAL OR OTHER FEDERAL LAW.

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- D. All sections of Title 50 Code of Federal Regulations, §§ 13, 17.22, and 17.32 are conditions of this enhancement of survival permit (attached). If any such regulations are modified, any future action taken with respect to this permit must be in accordance with such regulations in existence at the time such action is taken, except as specifically otherwise provided for by law.
- E. The authorization granted by this permit is subject to full implementation of, and complete compliance with the "Safe Harbor Agreement for California red-legged frog (*Rana draytonii*), California tiger salamander (*Ambystoma californiense*), Smith's blue butterfly (*Euphilotes enoptes smithi*), and Yadon's piperia (*Piperia yadonii*), at Palo Corona Regional Park, Monterey County, California" (Agreement), hereby incorporated by reference.
- F. The Permittee, and its authorized officers, employees, contractors, and agents, are authorized pursuant to the Endangered Species Act of 1973, as amended, to incidentally take the federally threatened California red-legged frog (*Rana draytonii*), threatened California tiger salamander (*Ambystoma californiense*), and endangered Smith's blue butterfly (*Euphilotes enoptes smithi*) on the property subject to the Agreement (Enrolled Property). The Enrolled Property is Palo Corona Regional Park, Monterey County, California. This authorized take must be incidental to otherwise lawful covered activities in accordance with the Agreement, and as such activities are described in the Agreement. This permit authorizes the amount of incidental take of the California red-legged frog, California tiger salamander, and Smith's blue butterfly as such is described in the Agreement.
- G. The Permittee is responsible for ensuring compliance with the Agreement and this permit by any authorized officer, employee, contractor, or agent while conducting covered activities. The Permittee must present and clearly explain all applicable provisions of the Agreement and this permit to all authorized officers, employees, contractors, or agents of the Permittee conducting activities covered under this permit. The Permittee must ensure that all avoidance and minimization measures are implemented as described in the Agreement.
- H. All notifications and reports by the Permittee to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (Service), as required herein and in the Agreement, must be provided to: Field Supervisor, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, Ventura Fish and Wildlife Office, 2493 Portola Road, Suite B, Ventura, California 93003; telephone (805) 644-1766.

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- I. The Permittee must notify the Service, in writing and by telephone, at least 60 days in advance of any planned activity that the Permittee reasonably anticipates will result in take of the California red-legged frog, California tiger salamander, and/or Smith's blue butterfly on the Enrolled Property, including a return of the Enrolled Property to the Baseline conditions, and provide the Service the opportunity to capture and relocate any individuals that could potentially be affected, if possible and appropriate.
- J. The Permittee must notify the Service, in writing and by telephone, at least 60 days prior to any transfer of ownership so that the Service can attempt to contact the new owner, explain the Baseline responsibilities applicable to the Enrolled Property, and seek to interest the new owner in signing the existing Agreement or a new one to benefit listed species on the Enrolled Property.
- K. The Permittee must notify the Service of new locations of California red-legged frogs, California tiger salamanders, or Smith's blue butterflies that are discovered within the area covered by the Agreement, and of the discovery of other listed species that are not covered by this permit, by telephone within 3 working days and in writing within 15 working days.
- L. Upon locating any dead or injured California red-legged frog, California tiger salamander, or Smith's blue butterfly on the Enrolled Property, or individual of any other listed species, the Permittee must notify the Service by telephone and in writing as described in the Agreement. Discussion with the Service will determine the course of action.
- M. The Permittee must meet all monitoring and reporting requirements as described in the Agreement, and must submit annual reports by November 1 following each year that this permit is in effect.
- N. The Permittee is not required to obtain a new permit if there is a change in the legal individual or business name, or in the mailing address of the Permittee. The Permittee must notify the Service in writing and by telephone within 10 working days of such change.
- O. The Permittee must refer to permit number TE41554A-0 in all correspondence and reports concerning permit activities.
