Conservation: First envisioned in 2016 and incorporated into the Park's General Development Plan in 2018, the summer of 2025 will shepherd construction of the monumental Floodplain Restoration Project at Palo Corona Regional Park. This project is possible thanks to the generosity and diligent work of community members, private firms, not-for-profits, state and federal agencies, and MPRPD's team. The former Rancho Cañada Golf Club will be restored into native habitat, and one-mile of the Carmel River into a dynamic tree-canopied floodplain. We are also mindful of our region's vulnerability to wildfire and have embarked on several wildfire mitigation projects.

At the end of each visit, we hope that everyone who partakes in MPRPD's or our wonderful partners' public lands and programs leaves as a better and inspired person – eager to come back for more!

Policies | Only service dogs are allowed at activities unless otherwise indicated. All policies are available online.




