Interested parties must reside within MPRPD's boundaries and satisfy other requirements noted in the [Guidelines](#). The term is 2 years, for up to 2 consecutive terms. The Committee meets annually, at a cycle to be determined.

The MPRPD Nominating Committee may conduct candidate interviews, and the Board of Directors will likely make appointments in December.

The Monterey Peninsula Regional Park District was established by voters in 1972 and entrusted to acquire lands for the express purpose of preserving open space and providing recreational opportunities. Since its inception, the District has successfully protected approximately 12,500 acres of open space and has acquired, or helped acquire a total of 24 parks and open spaces.
